Overview

- The City of Auburn Fee Schedule sets fees to be charged to customers when they initially connect to or change their existing connection to the City's water, sewer, or storm utility systems. To access online, go to www.auburnwa.gov and search for Fee Schedule, or click on City Hall, then Documents, and the Fee Schedule is near the top of the page. The intent of this handout is to provide an informative summary of selected sections of the Fee Schedule. This document is intended to aid in understanding Utility Connection Fees, and is not intended to replace or supersede any portion of the Fee Schedule or the Auburn City Code. Also included in this handout are the monthly rates as of January 1, 2024, which are for reference only and are subject to change at any time without prior notice.
- All Permits listed in this handout can be accessed on the City of Auburn's website, using the MyBuildingPermit.com Permitting Portal. (MBP)

What are Utility Connection Fees and what are they used for?

- Utility Connection Fees are charged for new connections to the Water, Sanitary Sewer, and Storm Drainage utilities systems, and/or for upgrades/changes to an existing service.
- The City of Auburn collects Utility Connection Fees for the customer's proportionate share of the capital costs and installation of the City's Water, Sanitary Sewer, and Storm Drainage utility infrastructure. The following pages of this handout contain the fee information about the different Utility Connection Fees.

When Are Utility Connection Fees paid?

- The City usually collects Utility Connection Fees at the time a building permit is issued. If a change in the service does not require a building permit, Utility Connection Fees then will be collected at the issuance of the associated permit. In cases where a facility extension is included in the building process, the permit will not be issued until after the new extension has been accepted by the City.

What do Utility Connection Fees consist of?

- Utility Connection fees typically consist of a **Permit Fee** and a **System Development Charge**.
 - ❖ The **Permit Fee** includes administrative costs, inspection time, and the cost of material if applicable (for example, where the City installs the water meter for the customer).
 - ❖ The **System Development Charge** is a charge imposed on new customers, or existing customers revising the use of their property, as their proportionate share and in recognition of the previous investment of the City and its customers in the utility system.
- Utility Connection fees may also include the following additional fees:
 - ❖ A **Utility Payback Fee** is an assessment recorded against the property. This fee was established to reimburse developers that installed utility infrastructure that benefits other parcels. Parcel(s) that benefit from said utilities must pay their pro-rata share prior to connection to the utility.
 - ❖ The **Charge in Lieu of Assessment** is a fee which is charged to a property that was not previously assessed for utility lines abutting the property.
 - ❖ A **Construction Permit Fee** is used to authorize construction in the City's right-of-way.
 - ❖ Property located outside the city limits installing utility lines may also be charged a **County Right-of-Way Permit Fee**. This fee is for a permit to dig within the county right-of-way and will be obtained by the City on behalf of the applicant.

STORM CONNECTION CHARGES

Connection fees are comprised of a Permit Fee and the System Development Charge as follows:

Level 3	<p>Level 3 Storm Permit Fees are based on the area disturbed by the project, as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• For projects with a total disturbed area of up to 10,000 square feet (SF), the total permit fee is <u>\$1,898.00.</u>• For projects with a total disturbed area between 10,001 SF and 43,560 SF (1 Acre), the total permit fee is <u>\$2,433.00 (based on \$1,898.00 plus \$535.00).</u>• For projects with a total disturbed area greater than 43,560 SF (1 Acre), the total permit fee is <u>\$2,443.00 plus \$136.00 per Acre</u> for each additional Acre or portion of an Acre disturbed.

Notes:

⁽¹⁾ Permit levels are determined as follows:

Level 1 permits are for all projects that:

- are not located in a Critical Area and
- add or replace less than 2,000 square feet of **hard surface** area*; and/or
- disturb less than 7,000 square feet of land.

Level 2 permits are for all projects that:

- add or replace 2,000 to 4,999 square feet of hard surface area; or
- disturb 7,000 square feet or more of land.

Level 3 permits are for all projects that:

- add 5,000 square feet or more of hard surface area; or
- convert $\frac{3}{4}$ acres or more of native vegetation to lawn/landscaped area; or
- convert 2.5 acres or more of native vegetation to pasture, or the new plus replaced hard surface area is 5,000 square feet or more and the value of improvements exceeds 50% of the assessed value of existing improvements.

***Hard Surfaces** are any impervious surface, permeable pavement, or vegetated roof.

Sample 1: Single Family Residence Parcel that adds or replaces less than 2,000 SF of hard surface and disturbs less than 7,000 SF of land (Level 1 permit).

Sample 2: Commercial\Industrial Parcel

Total of 55,000 SF parcel (30,000 SF Building and 20,000 SF Parking Lot, and 5,000 SF landscaping), therefore, there is 55,000 SF of disturbed area and 50,000 SF of new hard surface area (Level 3 permit):

base fee	\$ 1,898.00	(for the portion of disturbed area up to 10,000 square feet)
+	\$ 535.00	(for the portion of disturbed area between 10,000 and 43,560 SF)
+	\$ 136.00	(for the remaining 11,440 SF of disturbed area [portion of 1 acre])

+ SDC ⁽⁴⁾	\$33,826.92	([50,000 SF / 2,600 SF per ESU] * \$1,759.00)
Total ⁽⁵⁾	\$36,395.92	

Notes:

- ⁽²⁾ Based on one single-family residence or one duplex per parcel. More than one unit per parcel will be charged at the Other Parcel rate.
- ⁽³⁾ ESU or Equivalent Service Unit: A configuration of development of hard surfaces estimated to contribute an amount of runoff to the City's storm drainage system which is approximately equal to that created by the average single family residential parcel. One ESU is equal to 2,600 square feet of hard surface or any portion thereof.
- ⁽⁴⁾ When calculating the total SDC, a credit will be applied for the existing hard surface area except existing gravel surfaces (new total SDC minus calculated SDC for existing hard surface area using the definition of hard surface area as given in ACC 13.41.010). Although gravel surfaces are considered hard surfaces under ACC 13.48.010, existing gravel surfaces are not included in the calculation of the SDCs.
- ⁽⁵⁾ Charges in lieu of assessment or payback charges may be in addition to these fees and charges.

Connection fees are comprised of a Permit Fee and the System Development Charge as follows:

Sample 2: Commercial building with one side sewer connection and 1.5 RCE's of plumbing fixtures:

- ⁽⁶⁾ Residential Customer Equivalent (RCE): Calculated using King County Non-Residential Sewer Use Certificate.
- ⁽⁷⁾ Charges in lieu of assessment or payback charges may be in addition to these fees and charges.

IF ANY WORK ASSOCIATED WITH A SEWER PERMIT IS TO BE DONE IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY, A CONSTRUCTION PERMIT WILL BE REQUIRED IN ADDITION TO THE SEWER PERMIT.

King County Capacity Charge:

Sanitary sewer connections made on or after February 1, 1990, will be required to pay a King County Capacity Charge fee. Starting in 2024, the Residential Customer Equivalent (RCE) for single family homes will be based on the size of home. The rate per RCE for 2024 is \$74.23 per month for 15 years and is billed every three months by King County. Non-residential fees are determined by use. First payment is due about three months after the date of connection. No capacity charge is required for repairs.

- ⁽¹¹⁾ Applies only to Single-Family Residential meter.

⁽¹³⁾ Backflow protection and a separate backflow permit is REQUIRED on all irrigation and on all non-residential water meters.
